***In Her Nature* Celebrates the Courageous Women Shaping Wildlife Conservation Around the World**

PBS Nature celebrates Women's History Month with groundbreaking new digital series from all-female production team

NEW YORK, March 6, 2025 - Meet the fearless women who protect the wildlife of our world. From the spiny forests of Madagascar to the remote jungles of Costa Rica, witness cutting-edge science, grassroots initiatives, and the unwavering dedication of women fighting to safeguard our planet's most vulnerable species. Featuring breathtaking cinematography combined with rare animal behavior, ***In Her Nature*** showcases the robust conservation efforts being led by women in the most perilous habitats, through the lens of an award-winning, all-female production team. The digital series will premiere on the [PBS Nature YouTube channel](#) on **Thursday, March 13** and air biweekly on Thursdays.

"***In Her Nature*** was born from a desire to spotlight the incredible women leading successful, solution-driven conservation efforts across the globe—often against all odds," said Jocelyn Stokes, Director of Photography. "This series offers a fresh and hopeful perspective, proving that real change is happening and that these women are shaping the future of wildlife conservation."

"Getting to know these women while filming and really understanding the struggles they go through made me admire them even more," said Katie Schuler, director and producer. "I

couldn't help but be moved by their strength and resilience, and I knew I had to make sure their incredible stories were told in a way that truly honored their journeys."

The six episodes highlight powerful conservation efforts alongside never-before-seen wildlife behavior. The first female nature guide in Nepal helps triple the country's wild tiger population while also protecting rhinos. Two women in Costa Rica conduct the world's first-ever sloth census with the help of a sloth-detecting dog. In Madagascar, the first Malagasy herpetologist pioneers advanced genomic techniques to study chameleon populations, while groundbreaking blue-chip cinematography captures a species of lemur once thought extinct—now making a remarkable comeback thanks to the dedicated efforts of Malagasy conservationists.
